

You will read some incredible statistics and stories in this report. Because of you, these amazing results were possible. As BCM moves Forward with many great op-


portunities, we will remember who we are and whose we are, continuing to follow God's calling to serve others as we wish to be served. Thank You!

In September 2020, BCM earned its largest grant award in the amount of \$2M for rental assistance for City of Atlanta residents. Along with twenty other local service providers, more than \$18M in direct assistance was deployed. Due to our collective

success, in April, BCM was selected to enter a second tranche of funding in the amount of \$1.3M for rental assistance, working with six other agencies, successfully deploying an additional \$10M to City of Atlanta residents.

An Interview with Eloise Bracey, Chief Programs Officer at BCM

How has BCM evolved over the past 18 years you have been here?

When I started at BCM, there was a team of six employees and we worked in the basement of Covenant Presbyterian Church. My cubicle was next to the food pantry, which consisted of four shelves filled with canned goods and two deep freezers filled with bread. BCM's current conference table was used at Covenant Presbyterian Church to interview clients for financial assistance. That oversized table sat in the middle of our office space, so there was very little privacy when clients sat with volunteers to complete the service intake form. Volunteers completed the intake form, collected the client's ID and social security card, filed the paperwork in a manila folder, and recorded all the client's services

on an index card. There was very little discarding of folders or index cards during those days, so you can imagine the hundreds of folders and thousands of index cards.

Although hired as the Transitional Housing Program Manager, I also assisted with Emergency Assistance, packed groceries, and worked alongside the volunteers. The Transitional Housing Program helped 12 homeless families with housing for two years. BCM signed the lease for the families, paid their rent and utilities, conducted home visits, provided groceries, case management, financial literacy, savings match, and life skill classes. The Executive Director allowed me to mold the transitional housing program into a more efficient and client-centered program. This new direction allowed me to walk alongside the client, forming more of

a partnership. Volunteers were often the guest speakers for the life skills classes and budgeting/money management classes. To create more structure, we developed a more formal curriculum for life skills and money management classes. I researched other money management programs, ordered free money management booklets used with high school students, reviewed the information, and recommended my vision for the curriculum. The Executive Director wrote the money management curriculum, and volunteers were recruited for ideas and editing the material. The Executive Director and program staff created another program when the money management curriculum was ready for implementation with the transitional housing program participants. The premise behind the program, which I named the 70/30 program, was to have a continuum of services. Later on, this program would be called Budget for Life™

Since 2003, BCM has doubled the number of clients served annually, and tripled our staff. The financial assistance has doubled, and, in some cases, has tripled. The agency shredded the manila folders and index cards and evolved into a paperless record system. An online appointment portal for emergency assistance was created and implemented on BCM's website to streamline that process. Also, the agency shifted to staff working remotely, with appointments, case management meetings, classes, and staff meetings conducted virtually. The pantry had evolved into a sophisticated and well-stocked operation before finally closing due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

I have also seen a huge increase in requests for rent, mortgage, and utility assistance due to job loss or other crises. BCM continues to evolve as a collaborative agency with other community agencies. For instance, when our food pantry closed we donated our food, hygiene items and coolers and directed food donations and clients to Intown Collaborative Ministries. BCM's programs (Emergency Assistance, Foundation 3, and Budget for Life) have

evolved into more efficient and client-centered programs.

How many roles have you been in at BCM?

I have been in five different roles within BCM.

Why do you love your role specifically?

I love my role because I am passionate about people. My position at BCM allows me to solve problems by developing and implementing programs to help people build skills and gain education opportunities to improve their family's lives. I enjoy working with a team that is passionate about the well-being of others and want to see people reach their full potential. The benefit of working in five different roles during my years at BCM has helped me see how all the roles at BCM are essential for successfully carrying out our mission.

Why are you passionate about our Mission?

BCM's mission is easy to support and be passionate about because we are focused on keeping people from becoming homeless and elevating their possibilities for economic empowerment. I believe a person can focus on other areas of life and be successful when they have access to their basic needs, such as housing. Developing programs focused on preventing someone from experiencing homelessness is a tremendous responsibility, but that is what I love about our mission and my role as the Chief Program Officer.

Where do you see BCM and our programs in 5 years?

In 5 years, I see BCM with an increase in program capacity, increased donors, increased funding opportunities, larger and different fundraising events, and open dialogue regarding racial equity and inclusion.



NORTHSIDE CHURCH

A UNITED METHODIST CONGREGATION

Northside Church is your neighborhood church. Known for its Wednesday night supper, excellent preschool, and Dr. Burch's thoughtful sermons, Northside is also a mission-oriented congregation with a dedicated staff who all give back to the community.

In addition to financial support, Northside partners with BCM through volunteers and leadership on BCM's board, including Bert Ponder and Linda Outlaw. According to BCM's President and CEO, Keeva Kase, "Linda has had a fierce dedication to our programs and the service team, and currently chairs our Programs Committee. She is thoughtful, process oriented, and always thinks about the clients first. BCM's programs have tripled with the help of her leadership." Keeva continued, "Bert's heart and faith is what drew him to BCM. He currently serves as our Development Committee chair. He could be a member of any oth-

er nonprofit's board, but he chose BCM because of our mission. He is not only making an impact in the community, but a greater impact for God's Kingdom."

We are grateful for these amazing board members, and we wouldn't be where we are now without them.

In addition to board members, Northside Church also has some stand-out volunteers who continue to step forward for BCM's mission. Nancy MacDonald has served in roles across the organization including client intake, data entry, virtual emergency assistance, and the list continues. Mary Beth Gore, Volunteer and Church Support Manager, states that, "Nancy has become a "go to" volunteer who believes in BCM and wants to use her gifts and

talents where she is needed. She is a true example of a servant in our community. I am so grateful for her partnership with BCM."

Northside Church also has a staff willing to serve BCM's mission, especially Lynette Brown. Lynette is the Mission Director at Northside Church and is always discovering opportunities for parishioners to engage with different agencies around Atlanta. Lynette is a leader in our community and is someone whom the BCM staff turns to for advice and wisdom. "Northside is proud to partner with BCM to serve our community." Lynette shared, "As a church, part of our mission focus is to care for people who are experiencing homelessness. For many years, we have worked side by side with BCM because they have a shared

vision and they are incredible at making an impact that lasts. We know that when we support BCM with volunteers and finances, both will be handled with excellence. BCM is a great ministry that witnesses the love of Christ for those who are in need. This partnership makes us both better."

Finally, Northside Church is blessed to have Dr. Bill Burch leading the congregation. Dr. Burch is an active spiritual leader in the community and his wisdom and guidance around faithful mission work is well regarded by BCM's leadership. Bill's leadership during the pandemic - making the first investment in BCM as the pandemic unfolded - set the stage for BCM's successful fiscal year 2021.

Buckhead Church Serves

Each fall, Buckhead Church Embarks on Be Rich, which is the generosity and fundraising aspect of the Give, Serve, Love campaign. BCM is proudly one of Buckhead Church's partners that receives both significant financial and volunteer support from Be Rich. Thanks to the 2019 campaign, Tamara Hibbler learned of BCM and began volunteering. When COVID-19 began, Tamara was ready to get plugged in to BCM, volunteering wherever needed. We immediately trained her to become an Emergency Assistant Support - Online Application volunteer. She served in this role until recruitment for Money Management Coaches for Budget



for Life™ began in Fall of 2020. Excited at the prospect of becoming a coach, Tamara recruited her daughter, Essence, to fill her role as an Online Application volunteer. Quickly, they became an amazing BCM mother/daughter volunteer duo. Essence's passion for BCM's mission and the Atlanta community is evident and appreciated by those she serves. A client shared that after Essence

Sade's Journey through Budget for Life™

Originally from Rochester, New York, Sade moved to Florida at the age of 17 and lived there for 11 years. At 18, she was hired as a medical receptionist for a small family practice. She worked there for seven years and found herself in medical coding and billing. She was fascinated by the numbers and the alphanumeric characters; the world of coding made so much sense to her!

She relocated to Georgia with her partner and found a job at Emory. But soon after relocating, her relationship fell apart. She lost her job at Emory two weeks after telling them that she was pregnant with her second child. Desperate to get a job to support herself and her children, she stumbled across the Budget for Life™ program on BCM's website. The program sparked her interest because she always wanted to be financially savvy and achieve financial freedom but didn't know how. She was ac-

cepted into the program in 2020, and successfully graduated from the program in June of 2021.

The biggest takeaway from being in the program for Sade was learning how to budget her money correctly. She says, "I wish I found out about this program years ago; it could have eliminated my financial troubles sooner! Not only did I learn how to properly save, budget, and pay off debt the right way, but I now have the fundamentals from the program to teach to my two children." We are so proud of Sade and what she has learned, and we are encouraged by her successes to support her family.

A Foundation 3 Story

Jodie, a mother of 3 girls, lived in a homeless shelter called My Sister's House. Throughout her one-year stay, she participated in the shelter's programs, including life skills, vocational training, and much more. She even started working as a cook within the shelter! She wanted to find a higher-paying job to support her children, and her most significant barrier was not having her GED.

Jodie was referred to BCM's Foundation 3 program by the shelter's counselors. She was accepted into the program in August 2020, during the height of the pandemic. Upon hearing her needs, her Foundation 3 case manager successfully placed her in a 2-bedroom apartment and referred her to a free, online GED program through the Atlanta Public Schools that included a 10-week career readiness program. Jodie passed her GED tests and successfully completed her career readiness program. She is looking forward to starting her career and increasing her household income. Her long-term goal is to enroll in an online art program to receive a bachelor's degree in Graphic Design with a

concentration in 3D Modeling and Animation. She is a very talented artist.

In addition to working towards her career goals, she has also managed to pay off all her debt,

including two evictions and medical payments, and raised her credit score by 70 points. She graduated from the Foundation 3 program in August 2021 and says, "My involvement in the Founda-

tion 3 program and the support I received has motivated me to accomplish my goals and helped me become more hopeful and optimistic!"


